Snack Shop Employee Receives Unusual Treatment Plan

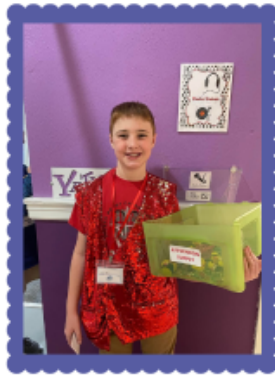
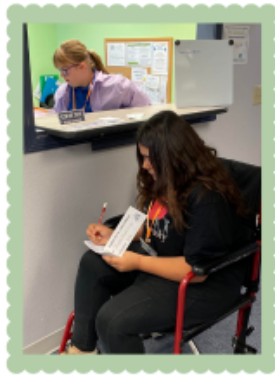
